

The Arabian Horse Society of Australia Limited proudly presents The AHSA Youth Ambassador Scholarship

The AHSA will offer two \$1,000 Scholarships for youth competing in open competition on registered Purebred Arabian or Arabian Derivative horse or horses with outstanding results.

The aim of these scholarships is to promote the Arabian horse and our youth and to help further develop the potential of the winning combinations. (If more than one horse is used each combination will be considered as part of the entry)

The \$1,000 awarded will be used to help cover expenses incurred by the winner and their horse in gaining further experience in open competition. This may be used not only for competition expenses but also clinics and lessons.

1. All applicants must be either under the age of 18 years as at 1st January 2010 for the competition year 2010 or aged 18-21 years as at 1st January 2010 for the competition year 2010. Nominations must be received at the AHSA office by close of business on 20th January 2010.
2. Each applicant will submit a signed log book of their performances in open competition. They will list each event, the level of the event (eg Novice, Advanced, Pony Club grade 3 etc), their placing and how many competitors competed. These performances must have been gained between 1st January 2010 and 31st December 2010.
3. Each applicant must also include a short outline of how they plan to utilise the money to further their experience should they be the recipient of the scholarship.
4. The requirements of conditions 2 and 3 must be submitted to the Secretary of the AHSA by no later than 20th January 2011. Copies of all applications will be distributed to the Directors of the AHSA, from which selected finalists may be required to attend an interview with Director/Directors.
5. The winner will be determined by the Board of Directors of the AHSA by 28th February 2011 and such decision shall be final. The winner will be announced in the March edition of the Arabian Horse News and the award will be presented at the Presentation Dinner at the Australian National Arabian Championships.
6. All applicants will receive one year's free subscription to the "Arabian Horse News", commencing from the closure of applications.
7. Categories eligible for the scholarship, but not limited to, include Showing, Dressage, Showjumping, Eventing, Pony Club competitions, Campdrafting, Stockhorse, Reining, Polo, Polocrosse, Endurance and Novelties.
8. Once an applicant has won the Scholarship, they are ineligible to enter again.
9. The winners will receive three years free membership of the AHSA and shall agree to keep the Secretary of the AHSA informed of their progress and achievements and will allow the AHSA to feature their results as a breed promotion.
10. The AHSA Ltd reserves the right not to make an award in any year that they feel the applicants have not reached a suitable standard.
